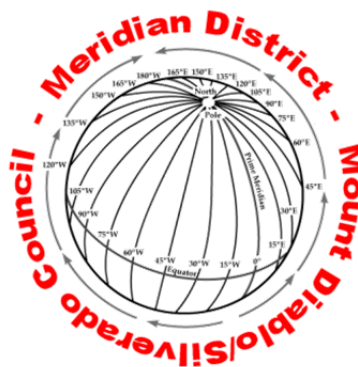


Meridian District 2017 Highlights
