- <u>Part C</u> is <u>also</u> required for all long term camps (>72 hours continuous) and must be filled out by a doctor every year! Get those physicals now!

Scout Camp

Just a reminder that ALL adults attending all long term camps (>72 hours continuous) e.g. Camp Wolfeboro, Camp Wente, etc. and <u>MUST be a registered BSA</u> <u>leader</u>. All the paperwork (BSA Adult app, YPT certificate, payment) needs to be turned at least 2 weeks before camp for processing.
